



# Miller Park Q&A's

## **What kind of time commitment is involved?**

An average game requires about 7 hours of work including set up before the game and clean up after. Report times are usually 2.5 hours before game time.

## **Is there any training?**

All volunteers are required to attend an annual training session at Miller Park before they're eligible to work a game. We strive to get most of our volunteers trained by mid-March. When you work your first game, the Group Leader, an experienced MQS volunteer, will train you to make sure you know what to do. However, games get busy, so if you're concerned about getting enough training, we recommend you select a weekday game as your first game so the Group Leader can spend more time with you.

## **What jobs are available?**

Working Miller Park is just like working a church festival or a fast food restaurant. Volunteers help prep food, cook food, work the cash registers and clean the booth.

## **Can I choose the job I'd prefer?**

The Group Leader usually assigns each worker a job. However, if you have a physical ailment or work restrictions, please let us know so we can coordinate accordingly.

## **Is there a uniform?**

Yes, there is a uniform. You must come to the game in black cotton pants or walking shorts, a white t-shirt, socks and tennis shoes (no open toe or open back). A shirt will be loaned to you when you get to the game and must be turned in before you leave. A hat is provided at your first game and you must bring it with you to every subsequent game. Hair must be pulled back and jewelry kept to a minimum.

## **Do I have to pay to park and can I park anywhere?**

We get a limited number of parking passes from Miller Park and they'll be distributed by the coordinator. If we run out of passes for a game, we'll ask you to carpool with another volunteer or pay for parking and we'll reimburse you. All volunteers must park in the Spahn lot (see the map on page 2). To get there, take Hwy. 41 North; exit at Wisconsin Ave./Bluemound Rd. and turn right onto 45th Street. Continue on 45th Street down the hill to 44th Street. Take 44th Street to the parking lot and show your pass to the attendant. After parking, go to the employee entrance at the north dock of Miller Park where you'll need to show your driver's license.
